## Maths and Numeracy

We will be revising money which will include recognising different ways to make an amount with notes and coins, calculating change and continuing on with the importance of budgeting. Through money we will be using the 4 operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division) to solve problems that involve totalling up a bill or splitting costs between friends. We will also look at the difference between debit and credit and using cards for transactions.



## Literacy

This term we will continue to develop our reading and comprehension skills through our reading in class and books will come home once a week. Please continue to sign the reading records if you share any reading time or chat with your child, as it shows us that this is supported at home. Spelling words are focused on each week and sometimes these will be as part of the homework to show you what we have been learning. With regards to writing we will be exploring play writing and poetry.
