### 1. Welcome and Introductions

Diane welcomed everyone and said how lovely it was that so many people had turned up.

#### 3. Head Teachers Report

A positive start to the term, three members of staff are back from maternity leave. Next year is looking OK for staffing levels, although with current probationers and long term contracts up for renewal and some long term sick PASs we are not certain yet.

RADs is still fantastic for the school, Bradley is back full time, Lee is coming back and Angus is here on a Thursday.

School Photos were today, Heather asked if they were worried about using tempest. everyone agreed that they were very happy with them.

There has been an IT upgrade with new white boards in all classrooms, they are wonderful, but the wifi needs upgraded to cope. The council is also upgrading to the new version of Windows for all teachers.

The Health Fair is next week and 20 outside partners are coming in, this involves lots of work. Parents will enter through the hall and then go to individual classes before coming back to the hall.

The school is taking part in the Big Sing, with over 3000 p4s going to Duthie Park to sing.

The school is currently involved in art projects with the community centre and the hospital.

The school is busy with lots of trips including Drum Castle, Duthie Park, Macduff Aquarium, Lathallan School, P7 trip and transitions.

#### 4. Pupil Equity Funding

Mr Evans explained that the government gives money to children living in poverty to try and close the attainment gap. We get a very significant amount of money, more than 5 times the school budget, Mr Evans does have to be able to explain why he spends the money. Mr Evans shared a draft of this, please see attached. The most money is spent on a Bernardoes Worker, this person has been in post for 4 years and knows the children and parents and how best to help them. Since he has taken up the post attendance has risen and it has been quite a while since a child was excluded from the school.

The school also spends money on Adventure Aberdeen, this breaks up a very long day for children sitting in classrooms, helps them concentrate and is therefore invaluable.

Money spent on Visible learning is for staff training.

Phil Badham teaches visible learning.

INCAS, measures attainment.

GI is assessment for learning difficulties.

Aberdeen City Council is going to buy Sumdog, so we will not have to pay for this in future.

Except for the panto, which the school very heavily subsidised, the school has not asked parents to pay for a school trip since covid.

Cornhill has been chosen by the Scottish Government to give a sample of what has proven to be effective, this is a 90 min meeting and Mr Evans is looking forward to it, and hoping it has a positive impact.

# 5. School Travel Plan

Mrs Bennett came to talk about the school's travel plan which promotes healthy and sustainable travel.

She handed out a draft of the information she has, and talked us through it.

As a school we have done a 'hands up' on children walking to school since 2008, so have historical data for comparisons.

The number of children travelling to school by car and taxi has gone down, a few children take a bus, but the majority, 76%, walk.

Our school is in the middle of lots of houses, so is quite easy for most children to get to.

What can the school do to get that number up?

The school has been conducting focus groups amongst the children to see what they don't like about walking to school. Some main points were dog mess, broken glass, and intimation by dogs and drunk people around the shops.

It was noted that there are no bins in the area, especially the field with the community gym that the children like playing in.

It was also noted that children are intimidated by dogs, even ones on a lead. Mr ME Evans says this is an ongoing issue, and he will add it to the newsletter.

What can be done about traffic? Can we start a park and stride. or a walking bus? This involves lots of paperwork and is ran by parents. We need to think of some way to change this, especially talking to parents of small children, who are more likely to drive to school.

Staff do drive, but this is because they live quite a distance away.

Heather to invite our counsellors and some older children to the next meeting.
